Join the Conference for lunch. After lunch depart for:

HIDDEN LONDON AND ST PAUL'S CATHEDRAL

We meet our Blue Badge London guide in Paternoster Square – next to St Paul's Cathedral. In 1666 the Great Fire of London swept away much of the London of our ancestors but the flames died away to leave one corner of the City untouched.

We head off towards Newgate via a maze of narrow streets and bygone alleyways. We discover a Tudor gateway, visit a plague pit and see the stately Charterhouse – and the homes of Sir John Betjeman and Hercule Poirot! This is Smithfield – so we will hear stories of jousting, executions and the Bartholomew Fair. We'll also visit the Victorian meat market, now beautifully restored and still trading.

Passing by the very spot where the Great Fire ended – we will return to St Paul's Cathedral. Our guide will give us a tour of this most wonderful cathedral, which arose phoenix like from the ruins of the Old Saint Paul's, which was destroyed in the Great Fire. We will visit the Crypt – home of the tombs of both the Duke of Wellington and Lord Nelson – before we return to the Choir and the short service of Evensong accompanied by the world famous choir of St. Paul's Cathedral.
