



A glimpse of the future

The Shanghai Transnational Partnerships School provides participants with a unique opportunity to gain insight into the future of partnership with Chinese universities.

As the research power of Chinese institutions grows, along with their attractiveness to international students, the nature of their partnerships with European, Australian and North American institutions is evolving rapidly.

The dynamism and pace of change in China's most international mega-city, Shanghai, has a direct impact on its universities. By exposing you to a range of partnership models in operation at a variety of the city's high quality institutions, you'll be in a stronger position to assess what type of partnership strategy and approach will work best for your university.



The programme

Commencing with an informal welcome on the Sunday evening from our hosts, Shanghai Jiao Tong University, the programme consists of a series of visits to institutions in and nearby Shanghai. You will have the opportunity to engage with presenters and other senior staff at each of these institutions.

The programme is styled as an immersive, intensive learning experience, designed to make efficient use of participants' time, but also includes ample opportunity for peer learning among the multi-national group of participants. Participants will be grouped into learning sets at the beginning of the programme with each set sharing their reflections with the others at the end of the week.

Evenings will involve visits to typical Shanghainese restaurants, to enable everyone to relax and network with each other, as well as our various hosts.

In addition to these sessions and visits aimed at exploring different partnership models, there will also be sessions led by senior legal and consulting experts with deep experience of helping clients with joint ventures in China, in higher education as well as other industry sectors.



Participation

Senior and middle managers working as directors of operations/administration/finance; directors of strategy, strategic partnerships, external relations or comparable roles; or with responsibility for establishing a joint venture project, will all benefit by participating in the programme. The number of participants will be limited to 30.

The fee is € 3,550 and includes all meals, accommodation, travel whilst in Shanghai and programme materials, but excludes travel to and from Shanghai.
