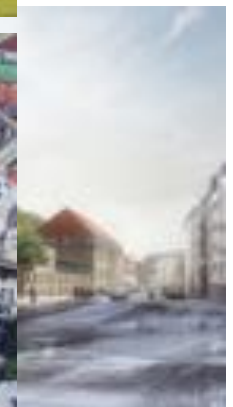

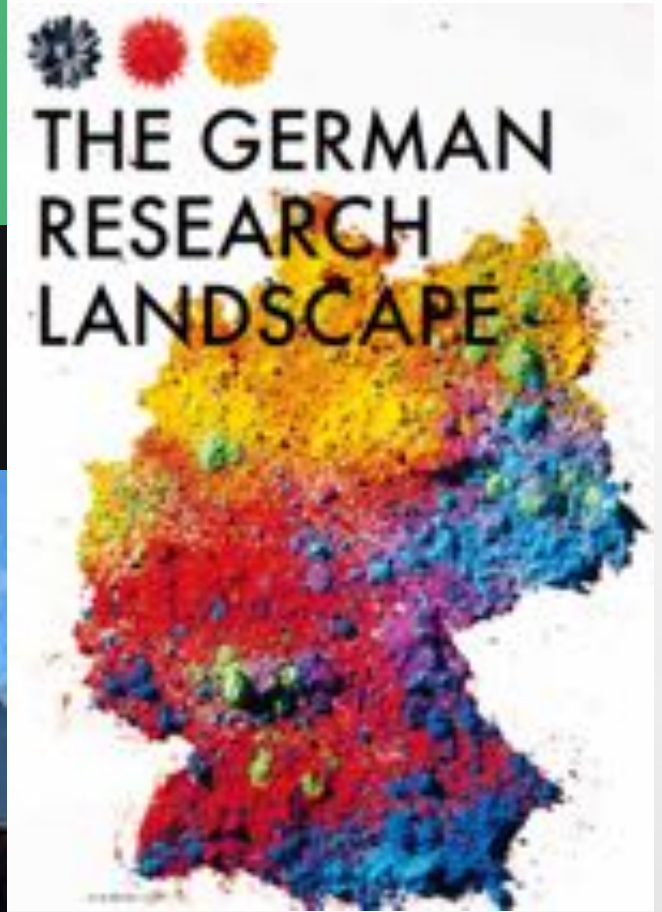
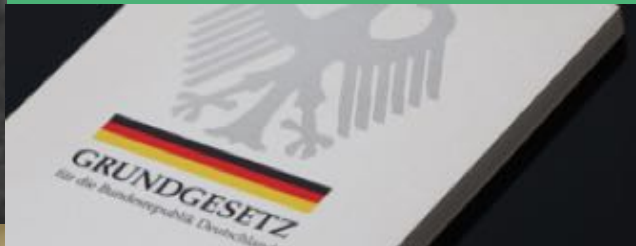

Art. 5 Basic Law:

Bavarian HE Act:

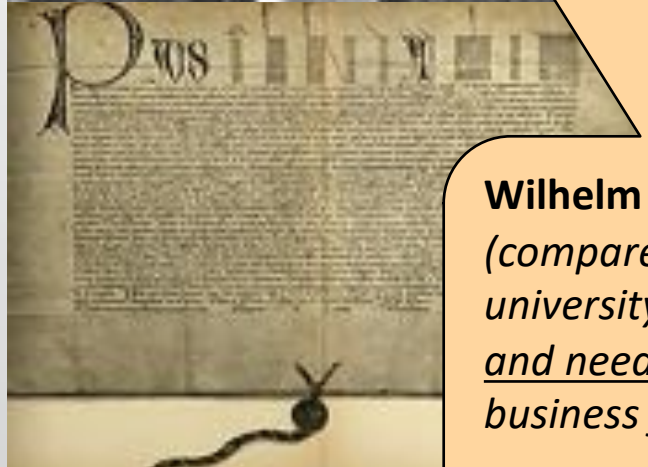
- *provide research-related higher education*

(compared to extra-university academies) "[...] the university is always more closely related to the practical life and needs of the state, for it is always engaged in practical business for it, the guidance of the youth.

Pius II, Papal Bull, 1459, allowing Ludwig, Duke of Bavaria, to found a university in Ingolstadt:

[The university is] *the pearl of wisdom, which points the way to a good and happy life ... through studying the sciences, the adorable beauty of virtues and moral values is acquired and the well-being of the entire human condition is increased, for the benefit of the state in its city of Ingolstadt in the diocese of Eichstätt ..."]*
