1 Dipoli

Dipoli is a popular meeting place and the building was originally designed in 1966 by Raili and Reima Pietilä as the new university building for technology students.

2 A Blanc

Designed by Alvar Aalto, the building previously known as Otaniemi's old shopping centre, currently shopping centre A Blanc, serves as the second service concentration on campus.

Harald Herlin Learning Centre

The Harald Herlin Learning Centre, designed by Alvar and Elissa Aalto, was renovated and reopened in Autumn 2016. It continues to operate as a library, offering dynamic spaces that support innovative and interdisciplinary learning, research, and work.

4 Väre

The Väre building is home to all departments of the School of Arts, Design and Architecture and has been designed according to user-centric and sustainable principles.

5 A Bloc

Shopping centre A Bloc is the main meeting place on campus. A Bloc is located in connection with the Aalto University metro station at Otaniementie 12.

6 Undergraduate Centre

Completed in 1964, the Undergraduate Centre designed by Alvar Aalto was previously known as the University of Technology main building, and it is still a landmark on the Otaniemi campus.

Marsio

Marsio, Aalto University's central meeting and event space, is open to everyone and located at the campus's heart. It offers versatile areas for students, researchers, and staff, fostering collaboration and innovation.

8 Kide

Kide is a research-focused building with facilities especially for the School of Science and the School of Electrical Engineering. The construction project started in February 2022, and the Kide building was opened in January 2024.
